It has been encouraging to see the enthusiasm of those who have committed to go on team and be a part of the first Face to Face Encounter. We have people from the Adelaide Community, the Sydney South Illawarra Community and one from the Darling Downs Community. These people are particularly dedicated, as they will be travelling enormous distances to be a part of it. Not only that, they have committed to be in Brisbane for the month of June while Face to Face is run.

Speakers are currently preparing their talks in readiness for training and critiquing on 6, 7 and 13 March 2018. All team members are looking forward to training and getting to know other team members. I'm sure we will all enjoy great fellowship together during these 3 days in March.

The first day of orientation/training (6 March, 2018) is open to the whole Brisbane North Coast Community. If you are interested in learning more about Face to Face with a view to being involved in the future, please join us at Sandgate Uniting Church at 9.30 am on 6<sup>th</sup> March. Please bring something for morning and afternoon tea to share and also bring your own lunch. Vince van Sant, the National Coordinator for Face to Face, will provide us with a full overview of the Face to Face program.

There is will be a pre-candle lighting community gathering at Sandgate Uniting Church commencing at 1.45pm on Tuesday 19 June 2018. In the Emmaus tradition it is essential that the community gather together to pray for the pilgrims and the team just prior to candle lighting. Whilst we recognise it is a working day, please try to set aside the time to attend. Candle lighting will be a little different for Face to Face but the impact should be the same as for Emmaus.

The closing ceremony for Face to Face will commence about 2.30pm on Tuesday 26 June 2018, also at Sandgate Uniting Church. Please support us by attending. It is always encouraging to hear what the pilgrims have to say. It is also encouraging for the pilgrims to see the Emmaus community in action.

At the time of preparing this article, I'm very happy to advise we have our first pilgrim sign up. I would ask the Community to not just consider sponsoring but to commit to praying for pilgrims for Face to Face. We will have 6 tables, 3 for women and 3 for men. That means at least 18 women and 18 men. We will be trying to keep a fairly even gender ratio.
