*Hello everyone*

*Another month has passed when we have not been able to get together and I know I am still missing being able to get together with the Emmaus community. My prayer is that you are all keeping well and staying safe through this time of isolation and able to connect with other members of the community in your area and share God's blessing with them.*

*The executive had a Zoom meeting at the end of June month to discuss what we would be able to do this year as well as other things.*

*We discussed the following.*

1. **Walks/Encounters** - It has been decided, because of the limitations of COVID-19, that all Walks/Encounters will be postponed until 2021. When things get back to the new normal, we will look at when campsites can be booked and training can be done.
2. **MailChimp** – Free vs Paid version. It was decided that we would go to the paid version even though our finances are not being replenished as we are not having gatherings and walks/encounters at the moment. Since the meeting, we have found the cost for MailChimp is not as simple as we expected and further investigation is needed before going ahead with the paid version. If anyone has experience with MailChimp and can give us some advice it would be appreciated.
3. **Website** – Things are now starting to progress with the new website and when it is operational we will let you know.
4. **Database** – New database is now operational.

# ***This month we here from our Community Face to Face Co-ordinator***

As many of you would be aware, our Brisbane North Coast Emmaus community added “Face To Face” to its umbrella of ministries a couple of years ago and we’ve now held three encounters. This ministry is aimed at the older members of our faith communities, for those who are retired or for physical or care responsibility reasons are unable to participate in one of our well known Walks.

At the closing ceremony when the pilgrims on a Walk are asked to share with the wider community what they intend to do in their Fourth Days I’m often surprised by the answers. Often the ideas or plans are unique and unexpected but certainly no less valid. The closing ceremony at “Face to Face” has been a very pleasingly, predictable experience with the pilgrims mostly commenting, that “they aren’t on the scrap heap yet”, or that “they can still be useful by doing.....”, or that “they can still help their grandchildren”, “or pray for others”. It’s such a positive experience for the team, for our older pilgrims and for our community to hear this.

About eighteen months ago an elderly member of my worship community invited me for a coffee. I didn’t know her and was a little apprehensive as to what we would talk about. She started the conversation by sharing with me a little about her life.

She and her husband and teenage sons had lived in Sydney but for quite some time had felt that God was calling them to move to country Queensland to a “land of milk and honey”. After much prayer and contemplation they did a holiday trip around the state and decided on a probable location. They moved, put the boys into the local high school and on their final day of unpacking decided that as a treat they’d go to a local cafe and enjoy a celebratory lunch. On walking through the door they were amazed to see above the counter of the cafe a large, wooden sign announcing, “The Land of Milk and Honey”. This was confirmation!!

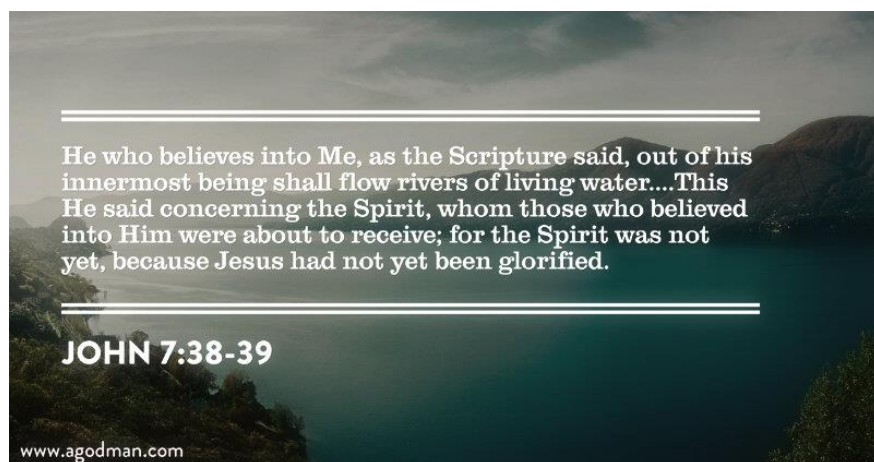
After the boys had been in school for several months, a teacher there complemented this lady on the way that she interacted with her sons and asked her if she would be interested in hosting a weekly afternoon tea with some other mums, whom he had in mind, who could benefit from her parenting strategies and she said, YES.

This group of ladies met each week for tea and scones. Gradually, over time, this parenting group changed its focus from teenage boys and became a bible study group. Eventually, after even more time, all seven ladies, including the hostess, enrolled in more formal courses through Trinity Bible College in Sydney. The ladies continued their tea and scones on Thursdays giving each other support and fellowship throughout their studies and eventually all graduated with various qualifications. The graduates then each went off and formed their own individual bible study groups!!

My friend smiled and to conclude her story said, “The town was well covered by God”.

She then gave me this advice, “ Karren, when you’re asked to do something then always say yes because you never know where it may lead or how it may advance the kingdom of God.”

I relate this story to you to encourage you to always say yes and to encourage you to value the importance of the older members of our faith communities. They are full of such wonderful experiences and can pass on to us such valuable advice and encouragement to help us in our own faith journeys.

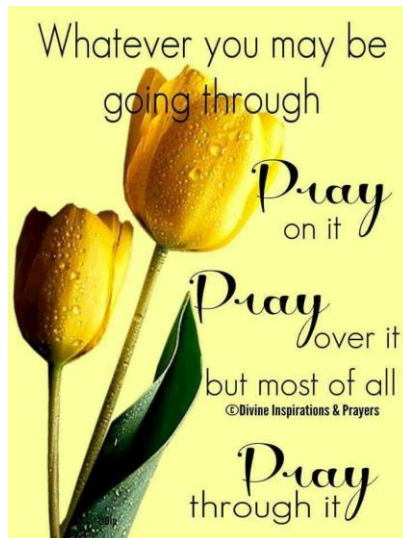

## **20 Prayers to Pray During This Pandemic**

1. For the sick and infected: God, heal and help. Sustain bodies and spirits. Contain the spread of infection.
2. For our vulnerable populations: God, protect our elderly and those suffering from chronic disease. Provide for the poor, especially the uninsured.
3. For the young and the strong: God, give them the necessary caution to keep them from unwittingly spreading this disease. Inspire them to help.
4. For our local, state, and federal governments: God, help our elected officials as they allocate the necessary resources for combating this pandemic. Help them to provide more tests.
5. For our scientific community, leading the charge to understand the disease and communicate its gravity: God, give them knowledge, wisdom, and a persuasive voice.
6. For the media, committed to providing up-to-date information: God, help them to communicate with appropriate seriousness without causing panic.
7. For consumers of media, looking to be well-informed: God, help us find the most helpful local information to equip us to be good neighbours. Keep us from anxiety and panic, and enable us to implement the recommended strategies, even at a cost to ourselves.
8. For those with mental health challenges who feel isolated, anxious, and helpless: God, provide them every necessary support.
9. For the homeless, unable to practice the protocols of social distancing in the shelter system: Protect them from disease, and provide isolation shelters in every city.
10. For international travellers stuck in foreign countries: God, help them return home safely and quickly.
11. For Christian missionaries throughout the world, especially in areas with high rates of infection: God, provide them with words of hope, and equip them to love and serve those around them.
12. For workers in a variety of industries facing layoffs and financial hardship: God, keep them from panic, and inspire your church to generously support them.
13. For families with young children at home for the foreseeable future: God, help mothers and fathers to partner together creatively for the care and flourishing of their children. For single mothers and fathers, grow their networks of support.

- God, provide for them financially, especially if they fall ill and are unable to work.
- God, help Christians in health care to exhibit extraordinary peace, so that many would ask about the reason for their hope. Give them opportunities to proclaim the gospel.
