Are you short-sighted or long-sighted? Perhaps you are fortunate that you can see well at any distance! What if we had 20/20 spiritual vision? Some of us are *big picture* people, others are *details* people and some can do both. Each of us is valued in God's big scheme of things so that God's love and grace is made visible, tangible to those who live in our circle of influence.

See You more clearly, love You more dearly, and follow You more nearly day by day!

That's the journey of discipleship we all on. Having our eyes opened so that we recognize Jesus, and grow as disciples is a big part of the message of Emmaus. May we grow in our seeing, our loving and our following, so that our lives reflect Jesus and his love and grace to others EVERY DAY.
